

You have had a hysterosalpingogram

This involved injecting a dye into your uterus to X-ray your fallopian tubes.

You may experience the following:

- slight discharge which may be slightly blood stained, lasting for the day of the examination
- period-type pain, one to two hours after the examination for which you should take your usual pain relief. This may last overnight.

However, if you experience:

- severe pain
- a temperature the day after the examination
- an offensive discharge
- significant bleeding

please contact your GP and tell him or her that you have had a hysterosalpingogram.

Please remember, as you have had drugs to prevent pelvic infection:

- you must **avoid alcohol for 48 hours**.
- you may experience an upset stomach.

There is a very small chance that you may experience drowsiness, dizziness, confusion or transient visual disorders. In the event of this happening, please do not drive or operate machinery.
